

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Well, here we are back in remote learning. Well done to all of you for handling the shift to remote learning as well as you have. I know that it is not at all easy to suddenly be back in lockdown with all of the concerns that brings. All I can say is that you have done a great job, and the children are doing a great job too.

Thanks also to our wonderful staff who have managed the transition back into remote learning and made sure that all of our students have had access to learning activities.

On Monday night school council met online. One of the things that we discussed was our school uniform here at Warrenheip. We have decided. after much deliberation, to change our school uniforms. The uniform tops have been hanging in the front office at school for some weeks now so you may have seen them, if not I have attached some photos to the email that show you what they look like. The new uniforms are a huge improvement on the current ones, and will really help to showcase our school especially when we are
