Well done! You have made it through 3 weeks of lockdown again and only three more to go. I hope that you are all bearing up under the stress we are all feeling. As we are (hopefully) now half way through this second period of lockdown I wanted to get in touch to let you know of a couple of upcoming things.

On Tuesday 25 August, the Department of Education and Training is presenting a free webinar for parents and carers by renowned child psychologist Dr Michael Carr-Gregg, on building family resilience during coronavirus.

Parents and carers play a vital role in helping children feel safe through uncertain times.

Dr Carr-Gregg's webinar is aptly named "Managing the Coronacoaster – Tips for building resilient families in the coronavirus era".

In this webinar, Dr Carr-Gregg provides tools and strategies for parents and carers to help manage the lockdown and remote learning. Topics include:

- your supportive role
- setting the emotional tone

- focusing on what you can control
- how to deal with disappointment
- further resources and where to get help.

Dr Carr-Gregg's presentation will run for 45 minutes. This will be followed by a 15-minute questionand-answer session in which parents and carers can ask Dr Carr-Gregg questions.
